By virtue of a warrant from Capt. W^m Markham and Com^{rs} dated ye ~~3^d~~ 3^d of ye 7th mo. 1682. Directed to ye survey^r Generall I do by authority ffrom him certifie in to ye Secretaryes office yt there was surveyed and laid out ye 4th of ye 7th moe 1682. unto Henry Hastings and Richard Buffington ffour hundred acres of land in ye County of Chest^r. Beginning at a Corn^r spanish oak standing by markes creek thence ~~unto~~ E.N.E. by a line of trees ffour hundred ffourty eight p^{ches} to a corn^r poplar tree thence, S.S.E. by W^m Woodmansons and Michell Isards land one hundred ffourty six p^{ches} to a corn^r white oak, ffrom thence W.S.W. by a line of trees ffour hundred fifty one p^{ches} to a corn^r white oak standing by ye aforesaid markes Creek, thence along ye severall courses thereof to the place of Beginning, And is accordingly entred and recorded in ye Survey^r Generals office at Philadelphia ye 19th 2^d moe 1690.
