These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Ezekiel Harland according to the method of townships appointed the sd quantity of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already surveyed nor taken up nor is conceald nor seated by the Indians, and make returns thereof into the ~~secretaries~~ secretaries office at Philad<sup>ia</sup>. Given under our hands and seal of the sd. Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1707.
