

Surveyd and laid out the 12th of October 1717 by virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 27th of September 1717 unto Abraham Heer a certain tract of land on Conestogee creek in the county of Chester Beginning at a post by the said creek at a corner of Alexander ~~Blythe~~^{CWS's} ~~land~~ and running by the same west forty eight perches to a corner white oak then north west four hundred and twelve Poles to a black oak Then north two hundred and ninety three Poles to a post Then south east by a tract laid out to Harice Tubert Isaac Goffman and Melker Pennermon three hundred and twenty Poles to a post Then north north east by the tract last named thirty six perches to a post then south east one hundred and ninety Poles to a post by the said Conestogee creek Then down the same on several Courses two hundred eighty eight Poles to the place of Beginning. Containing six hundred acres with the usual allowance of six P Cent. Returned into the Secretary's office, Novem^r 26. 1717.
