



These may certify that by virtue of three warrants under the hands of the proprietors Commissioners and the seal of the Province one for 200 acres dated the 9th of 9th 1702 one for three hundred acres dated the 20th of 9th 1703 and one more for 300 acres dated the 20th of 10th 1703 all in right of servants I surveyd to Philip Howel a certain tract of land in the township of Sadberry in ye County of Chester. Beginning at a corner marked Hickery tree at the south east corner of a tract of land surveyd for ye Proprietors use thence east by north crossing Octoraro near the fork thereof 300 perches to a small hickery thence north by vacant land and the land of William Clayton 462 perches to a post thence west by south by vacant land 300 perches to a post thence south by the land of Thomas Hayward and the proprietor 462 perches to ye place of Beginning containing 800 acres with the usual allowance of six acres to every 100 acres for roads and high ways. Surveyd 8th 27th 1709.
