That we would grant him a resurvey on two hundred and twenty acres of land laid out in the township of Haverford and County of Chester by virtue of a Genl<sup>l</sup> warrant from the Prop<sup>rs</sup> for laying out of the Welch tract bearing date the 14<sup>th</sup> of the first Month 1684, in right and as part of 3000 acres Originally purchased by Lewis David of the Prop<sup>rs</sup> who sold 500 acres parcel thereof to Will<sup>m</sup> Hawel who conveyed the sd 220 acres parcel of the sd 500 to the sd David Hugh: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey to the sd David Hugh the sd two hundred and twenty acres Situate & laid out as aforesd and make returns thereof into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia, where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of this return into his office. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
