 Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Prop<sup>ty</sup> bearing dat the 18<sup>th</sup> day of the

12<sup>th</sup> mo 1702, directed unto me I do hereby certify that I have surveyed the 13<sup>th</sup> day  
 of 1<sup>st</sup> mo. Ensuving unto Capt Samuel Finney a certaine tract of land in the  
 County of Philadelphia begining at a Chestnut marked in a line of Joseph  
 Fishers land being a corner deviding it from Thomas Siddnes land from  
 there by a line of marked trees in same land south west 503 perches to a  
 stake set in the ground in the reputed Susquehanna Roade from there by the said  
 roade south east 267 perches to a black oak Sapline marked deviding it from the  
 reputed land of Robert Wilkston from there by a line of marked trees and same land  
 north east 503 perches to a stake set in the line of the abovesd Fishers land there by  
 the same land & line of marked trees north west 267 perches to the plac of be-  
 gining containing and Resurveyd for eight hundred and thirty nine acres and  
 a half & 71 perch of land and is according to the bounds above decreed Returnd  
 into the Generall Surveye office at Philadelphia the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> mo.  
 ensweing the dat above mentioned.
