At the request of Mary Fletcher Widow That I would grant her a resurvey on  
a certain tract of land whereon she is seated, Situate in Oxford township  
in the County of Philadelphia reputed to contain two hundred fifteen acres  
and a half 11 1/2 <sup>ye of</sup> acres, bought in a tract of 200 acres of Thomas Dacket, and  
104 acres of Rob<sup>t</sup> Adams: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause  
to be resurvey'd the said tract according to its first lines of survey, and make  
returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at  
Philadelphia the 20<sup>th</sup> of the first month 1700,
