At ye request of Ralph Fretwell & Comp^{rs} yt I would grant him to take up ye Long Island on Skulkill called Barbadoes, & a tract of land either in ye County of Chester or on Skulkill in ye County of Philadelphia: These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye sd Island & ye tract of land, if in ye County of Chester, so much land not under ten miles, & not exceeding twelve miles square; & if on Skulkill beginning on ye hither end of ye long Island call'd Barbadoes, to run upward on each side of Skulkill six miles on ye water side, & to go backward not less y^e seven miles, & not exceeding more y^e twelve miles on each side, where not already taken up according to ye Method of Townships, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Lewis, ye 16th of ye 6th mo. 1684. The Long Island was agreed upon before.
