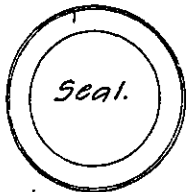

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the s^d Thomas Fairman according to the method of townships appointed the s^d quantity of six hundred and sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre ~~more~~ of land in this Province. that has not been already surveyd nor taken up nor is conceald nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the general Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrant is to remain, and a copy thereof to be delv^d to thee certified by the Secretary.
