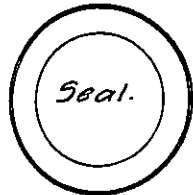


Pensilvania (obl.)

Harley Esq w^{ch} right the said Thomas has purchased: These therefore are in pursuance of the said grant from the Prop^{ty} to resurvey to the said Thomas ffairman in right of the said Thomas Harley's purchase the said several tracts of land provided they amount not in the whole to above one thousand acres ~~including~~ together with the tract late in the Tenure of Mary Bradwell held as rent land to be part of the said quantity but to be held on the same Tenure as before unless purchased off, And provided further that no other persons just right or claim be invaded thereby And make returns into the Gen^l Surv^{rs} office where this warrt is to remain and a copy
