*By the Commissioners of Property.*

*At the request of Thomas George of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up three hundred acres of land in this Province for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use thirty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to surveyor cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas George according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred acres of land in the said Province that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Thomas fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month Anno Dom 1714.*
