

I do hereby certify That by virtue of a warrant under the hands of the Commiss^{rs} of Property and the seal of the Province to David Powell directed bearing date the 6th day of the 2^d month 1702. The said David Powell hath made return into the General Surveyors office of the resurvey of a piece of land resurvey'd to Robert Fairman the 10th day of the month and year aforesaid which being examined & revised in the said office is as followeth. viz^t Situate in the county of Philadelphia extending (from a corner by the Kings Road) north north west by a line of marked trees and Edward Rees his land 23 perches to a maple tree by a small run of water dividing this from Neals ~~land~~^{Loyken} his land called Poor Island from thence by the several courses of the said Run east northeast 7 perches north east by east 3 perches north east 4 perches north west by north 6 perches north east by east 10 perches east 8 perches north north east 10 perches west north west 8 perches east north east 15 perches north west by north 4 perches east north east 12 perches east 6 perches northeast ^{per} 8 northeast by north 10 perches north northeast 16 perches east southeast 30 perches northeast 6 perches east south east 16 perches south 10 perches south southeast 6 perches east northeast 24 perches north east by north 36 perches east 30 perches to a fork of the said run from ^{thence} by the several courses of another branch of the said run north northeast 24 perches east 3^{deg} north 6 perches north west 4 perches northeast 10 perches north northeast 19 perches to a maple tree by the Sosiveys land: thence south east by south 50 perches: from thence west south west 72 perches by Francis Pauls land to the first mentioned Run from thence by the same south west by south 20 perches to the said Kings road thence by the same south 65 degrees west 78 perches thence south 63 degrees westerly 58 perches thence south 72 degrees westerly 57 perches to the place of Beginning Containing 52 acres Returned into the Secretaries off^{ce} the day of the 4th month 1702.
