

By Vertue of two Warrants under the Hands of the Commissioners of Property and the Seal of the Province the first bearing date the 28th of the 3^d month 1708 and the other the 10th of September in the same year each of them for surveying unto Thomas Fairman of Shackumaxon in Philadelphia County five hundred acres of land in right of his purchase of five thousand acres of Thomas Harley Original purchaser of the said Quantity.

There was surveyd & laid out on the sixth day of November next following one thousand acres of land in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a Black Oak in a line of John Penn's land and running by the same southeast three hundred thirty four perches to a post Thence southwest four hundred and eighty perches to a Locust tree Thence by lands laid out to Jonathan Haise and _____ Smith northwest three hundred thirty four perches to a Spanish Oak Thence northeast four ^{hundred} and eighty perches to the place of Beginning
