At y^e request of Edward Green, y^t I would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land at Susquahanna, or, if not layd out any there before y^e spring next, in any of y^e Counties already fixt here. These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y^e sd number of acres according to y^e promises he seating & improving y^e same wthin one year from y^e date of survey, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia y^e 2^d of y^e 6th 1684.
