These therefore are to authorise and require thee exactly to survey the whole sd tract as now held and claimed by Edw^d Farmer & Thomas Farmer or their assigns according to the most fixed outlines thereof and also (as far as thou shalt find requisite) according to the subdivision of the same, and make returns into the Gen^l Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv^d to thee certified by the Secy. Given under our hands & Province seal at Philad^{ia} 22^d of Nov^r 1703.
