

Pennsylvania.

By virtue of an assignment made over in the Court at Upland the 25th of ye 9th mo. 1677 from James Sanderlin and Lawrence Cook to Walter John & Francis Forrest, four hundred and seventeen acres of land situated & being on ye north east side of Polquessirick Creek, & surveyed unto them ye 8th of ye 8th mo. 1678, & since by virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary & Govern^r dated ye 21st of ye 12^{mo} 1683. Directed to me, I hereby certify into his Secretary's office, yt I have caused to be resurvey'd ~~at~~ unto them ye sd land beginning at a corner marked pine tree, standing on Delaware River, from thence down ye severall Courses of ye sd River to ye mouth of Polquessirick Creek & up ye Severall Courses of ye sd Creek to a corner marked (o.p.l.) from thence E 63 $\frac{1}{4}$ N by the land of John Gilbert 235 perches to a corner marked oak, from thence S.S. E by ye land of John Fast 200 perches to ye first mentioned pine tree, and is accordingly Entered & Recorded in my office, Philadelphia this 12th of ye 5th mo. 1684.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty-seventh day of August 1909.
