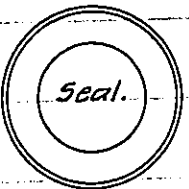

William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Pennsylvania



& ye Territories, therunto belonging.

At ye request of Jasper Farmer jun<sup>r</sup> in ye behalf of his Father Major Jasper Farmer, his brother Richard and himself, yt I would grant him to take up five thousand acres of land being of ye lands by ye Indians call'd Umbilicarmence fronting at one end upon ye river Skulkill. These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye sd five thousand acres in ye aforementioned place where not already taken up, according to ye Method of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia ye 31<sup>st</sup> of ye 11<sup>th</sup> month 1683.
