At the request of James Fox, Francis Rawle, Nich<sup>s</sup> Pearce and Richard Gove, in the behalf of themselves and other friends of Plymouth, Joynt purchas<sup>r</sup> with them of Five Thousand acres of land, That wee would grant the said five Thousand acres of land might be laid out together for a towneshipp, in the most convenient place for water, for the Encouragement of the Woollen Manufacture, intended to be set up by them.

These are therefore in the Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto them the said numb<sup>r</sup> of acres in the aforesaid County where not already taken up, according to the method of towneshipp appointed by the Govern<sup>r</sup> they seating and improving the same within six months after the date of survey and make returne hereof to the Secretarys office. Dated at Philadelphia the ffifth of the ffifth month 1686.
