

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 26<sup>th</sup> of 8<sup>br</sup> 1702 for Resurveying unto John Ball a certain Tract of Land in his possession within the Liberties of the City Philad<sup>ia</sup> reputed to contain Seventy Acres. Resurvey'd the said Tract of Land beginning at a post standing by Mill Creek thence down the several Courses of the said Creek one hundred and fifty six perches to a branch of the said Mill Creek. Thence up the several Courses of the said branch seventy two perches to a White oak. thence East by Adam Road's Land and vacant Land Ninety eight perches to a black oak. Then South by John Thomas his Land one hundred and forty ~~perches~~ perches to the place of beginning. Containing Seventy three Acres.
