These are therefore to Authorize & require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the sd David Breintnall according to the method of Townships appointed the full quantity of two hundred & fifty acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd, nor taken up, nor is Seated by the Indians and Make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philadelphia. the Eleventh day of the Eighth month in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred & ten.
