in Great Britian but ^{now} of this Province. that We would Grant them three
Hundred Acres of Land on Schuylkill river joyning to a Tract of
Land lately Granted to John Reater for which they agree to
pay to the Propriet^{rs} use five and fifty Pounds for the whole
and the Usual Yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling fore-
ry Hundred Acres.

These are to Authorize and Require
thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Benj. Bark
and John Pot the Said Quantity of Three Hundred Acres of
Land in the Place aforesaid That is clear of other Surveys &
Claims and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office
which Survey in case the ^{sd} Benjamin and John fulfill the above
agreement within one Year after Location Shall be Valid other-
wise the Same is to be Voyd as if it had never been made or
this Warrant ever Granted. Given under our Hands and Seale
of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the 7th Month
A.D. 1714.
