

Where as Richard Sparkes Late of Philadelphia deceased did by his Last Will and Testament dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January 1715/6 Give and bequeath One hundred foot of the back end of his Lot on the South Side of the High Street in Philadel<sup>a</sup> for a Burying place for the People or Society called Seventh day Baptists. This may certifie that on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1728 the said Piece of Ground bounded Northward with the Remainder of the said Lot. Eastward with George Fitzwater's Lot. Southward with Chesnut Street Lots. Westward with fifth Street from Delaware— being in Breadth twenty six foot and in Length One hundred foot. was Surveyd and Set out by me.
