

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> month 1701 for Surveying unto John Ball twenty five Acres of Land within the Liberties of the City Philadel<sup>ia</sup> in right and as part of twelve hundred and fifty Acres originally purchased of the Proprietary by Jn<sup>o</sup> Rowland of whom the said Jn<sup>o</sup> Ball purchased the same.

Survey'd and Laid out unto John Ball a piece of Land within the Liberties of the City Philadel<sup>ia</sup> beginning at a post standing at the Corner of a Tract of Land belong to John Marshal. Thence by another Tract of Land belonging to the said Jn<sup>o</sup> Ball North Sixty one perches to a post. Thence East by the Land of Philip James forty six perches to a post. Thence by vacant Land East thirty four degrees North fifty two perches to a post. Thence South forty four perches to a post. Then west by John Powel's Land twenty one perches to a post. Again by the sd Powel's Land Nineteen perches to a post. Thence west south west by Land Reputed to belong to the Successors of Samuel Allen seventy one perches to the place of beginning Containing twenty five Acres. Survey'd the 26<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1702 by David Powel.
