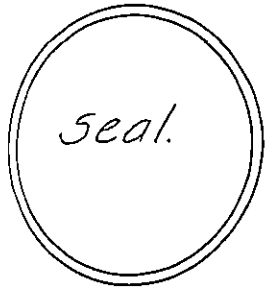

William Penn, Absolute Proprietary and Governour in  
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Territories  
thereunto Belong<sup>g</sup>

At the Request of George Heathcott Attorney for Thomas Bar-  
ker that I would Grant him a Warrant to Lay out the Peice of  
Swamp that Belongs to his Towne Lott on the West side of  
the Dock. These are to Require thee to Survey or cause to be  
Survey'd unto the said George Heathcott, <sup>for sd Thomas Barker</sup> the Said Piece of  
Swamp and make Returnes there of into my Secretaryes Office  
Dated att Pensbury the 7<sup>th</sup> day of ye 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1701.
