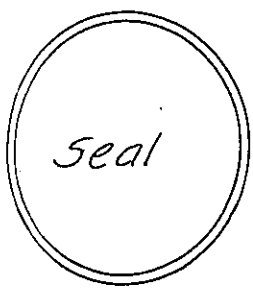

William Penn, Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r In Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Ann and Sarah Bennet That I would grant them to take up four hundred Acres of Land in right of their Father William Bennet, Purchaser of a thousand Acres whereof 400 are already taken up. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto them the 5^d Number of Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already taken up, nor conceded, nor cleared by the Indians, to be laid out according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, and make Returns there of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the sixth Month 1700.
