By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of John Budd of Philadelphia, Brewer. That We would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in this Province being the Remainder & full Complement of John Grey (als Tatham) his Original Purchase of five thousand Acres of the Proprietary, of which the sd John Budd hath purchased of the ~~Executor~~ ^{Thousand} of the sd Tatham's Estate, two ~~hundred~~ Acres. These are to Authorize and Require You or (upon Agree^{mt} between yourselves) One of You to Survey and layout to the sd John Budd the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in the County of Chester or the Borders thereof within this Govm^t where not already Survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed, nor Seated by the Indians, according to the Method of Townships, in a Tract distinct and wholly Separate from that Tract of Six hundred and twenty five Acres granted to the sd John by a Warr^t from ourselves bearing even date herewith. And make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 23^d 12^{mo} 1702.
