By vertue of a war<sup>t</sup> from ye Proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> dated ye 10<sup>th</sup> of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mon<sup>o</sup> 1683 directed to ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall. I do by Authority from him Certifie into ye Secretaryes office that there was Surveyed and Laid out the 27<sup>th</sup> of ye said mon<sup>o</sup> and year unto Eliz. Barber her Lott in ye Liberties of Philadelphia Proportionable to ye Purchase John Barber (deceased) of 2500 acres, Begining at a Corn<sup>r</sup> tree of John Day and Comp<sup>q</sup> Land. thence ~~E.N.E. by a~~ N.S.W by a line of trees one hundred and thirteen perches. thence N.N.W. by a Street or Road fifty six perches and a halfe. from thence E.N.E. by a line of trees One hundred and thirteen perches. thence S.S.E. by a line of trees fifty six perches and a halfe to ye place of begining. Containing and Laid out for Fourty acres of Land. which is Accordingly Entred and Recorded in ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall's Office at Philadelphia ye 24<sup>th</sup> of ye 7<sup>th</sup> moneth 1691.
