street where they fell & also the Land allotted w<sup>th</sup> in ye Liberties proportio-  
nable. These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be  
survey'd unto him ye Lotts where they fell & his Proportion of Land  
w<sup>th</sup> in ye Liberties he fencing y<sup>m</sup> in & build upon ye Lott in the front &  
clear y<sup>t</sup> in High Street w<sup>th</sup> in six Month after ye Date of ye Survey and  
make returns there of into my Secretary's Office. Given at Phila-  
delphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> ~~1700~~<sup>5<sup>th</sup></sup> 1684.
