Whereas there was Survey'd in the Year of our Lord 1686 on the West Side of the River Schuylkill unto William Frampton in Right of ~~Thomas~~ ^{William} Bowman's original purchase the quantity of five hundred Acres of Land which Since the decease of the Said William has been taken by a resurvey within the Tract Called Pickrings Mines by means whereof the Same is Granted to the ~~descendants~~ ^{Assignes} of the Said Pickring and the heir of the Said Frampton disappointed in the Said Land and having Sometime Since Granted the said five hundred Acres with other Lands & premises unto Abraham Bickly of Philad^a the sd Abraham desires that the Same might be laid out to him in the nearest vacancy to the first Surveyed five hundred acres. These are therefore to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Abraham Bickley in the nearest vacancy to the afore said Survey the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated, nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation.
