These are to require Thee to Resurvey ye sd tract of Land Scituate as aforesd according to its true bounds and first Lines of Survey and make Returns thereof into ye Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Delivered to thee Certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands and ye Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> ye 29<sup>th</sup> day of ye 7<sup>mo</sup> 1702.
