At the Request of John Blake now of or near Conestogo—that We would Grant ~~him~~ him to take up among the late Surveys made in those parts the quantity of One hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use Ten pounds Mony of Pensilvania and the Yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for ye same. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said John Blake in the parts aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of One hundred Acres that has not been already Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns there of into the Secretarys Office, which Survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
