

Survey'd and Laid the 24<sup>th</sup> of the 8<sup>th</sup> Month 1716. by Virtue of the Commissioners's Warrant date 28<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>mo</sup> 1715<sup>o</sup> to Peter Beller a Piece or Parcel of land in Strasburg in the County of Chester. Beginning at a Black Oak in a line of Coll. John Evans's Land and at a Corner of Daniel Harmers Land. Thence by the said Harmers Line South by East four hundred perches to a Corner post. Then by John Funks Land West by South One hundred and Six perches to Poplar Tree Marked. Then by the Lands of Henry Carpenter & John Bundely North by West four Hundred perches to a post. Then East by North by the Land of Henry Goldney and Company and by the said John Evans's land One hundred and Six perches to the place of Beginning. Containing two hundred and fifty acres with an Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent as Usual. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 8<sup>th</sup> of March 1717 $\frac{1}{2}$ .
