Containing 168 acres  $9\frac{1}{2}$  and 4 perches of land. And another tract of Land Joyning to ye former menconed Begining att Darby Creek and Runing upon ye same ~~marked~~ line of marked trees East North East 292 p<sup>ches</sup> to stak sett in ye ground from thence by a line of marked trees part by David Lewis land and part by Thomas Ellis Daughters land South South East 180 p<sup>ches</sup> to a stake Deviding it from Evan Williams Land from thence by a line of marked trees and same Land West South West 258 p<sup>ches</sup> to a white oak marked by Darby Creek from thence by ye Severall Courses of ye same to ye place of Begining.
