These are to Authorize and Require theeto Survey or Cause to be Surveyd unto the said Richard Anderson inye Place aforesaid including his said Improvements the said Quantity of One hundred acres of Land Contiguous to the Lines of the adjacent Surveys and make Returns there of into the Secretary's Office which Survey in Case the said Richard fulfill the above Agreement within three months after the Date here of shall be valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it never been Made nor this Warrant ever Granted.
