Ellot for himself, his Wife & 2 Servants Two hundred Acres of Land, every  
one, behinde their respective Lotts as above said, according to y<sup>e</sup> Way &  
Method agreed on for Townships, & this shall be thy Warrant. Given at  
Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 23 of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Mo 1682
