



Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania &c. bearing date the 13 day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 170<sup>2</sup> to resurvey unto myself Two Certain Tracts of Land in Bristol Township in the County of Bucks which said Two Tracts are Contiguous and begins at a black oak being a corner of Samuel Smiths Land Thence by the same Land South South East Three hundred and Twenty perches to a post Thence north east by east by Joseph Large fifty two perches to a post & stones Thence by John Surket's Land north north west two hundred fifty two perches to a post Then by said Surket's Land & by the ~~Manor~~ Manor of Pensberry north forty seven degrs. East one hundred and ninety prs to a post and stones Then by Lawrence Pearson and Anthony Burtons Land north west by west two hundred and sixty perches to a post and stones. Then by Thomas Torry's Land South west by west one hundred and fifty six perches to a post and stones. Then by Edmund Lovet and Samuel Smiths Land South east by east two hundred twenty four perches to a post & stones Then by said Samuel Smiths Land south west by west fifty five perches to the black oak the place of beginning containeing three hundred fifty four acres ninety two perches resurveyed and certefied the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> month 170<sup>2</sup> P
