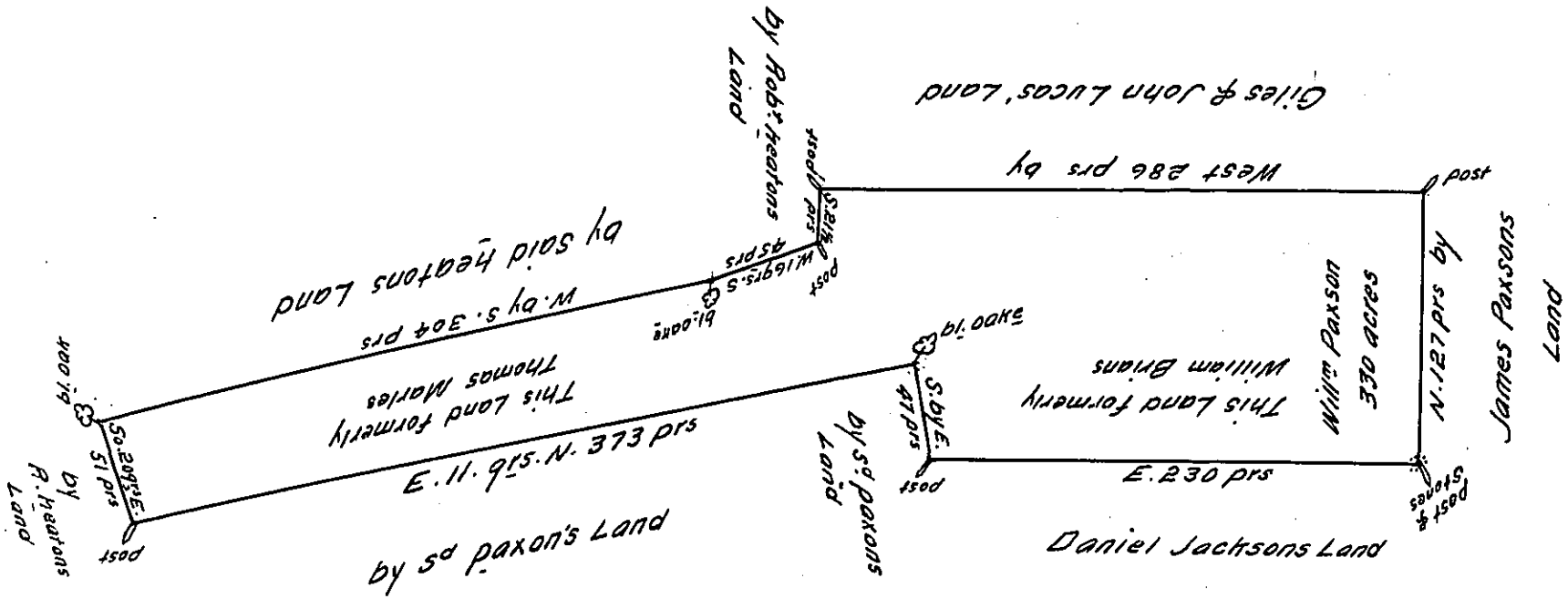

Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed by Edward Pennington
 Surveyor General dated the first day of the 12th month 1701 to Resurvey
 unto William Paxson Two Tracts of Land which said Tracts are contiguous
 and begins at a black oak Thence by Robt. Heaton's Land South Twenty degrs East
 fifty one perches to a post Then by other Land of said William Paxson East eleven
 degrs North Three hundred seventy three perches to a black oak Then south by east
 forty seven perches to a post Then east ~~three~~^{two} hundred & thirty perches by Daniel Jacksons
 Land to a post ^{& heap of stones} Then by James Paxson's Land North one hundred Twenty seven perches
 to a post Then by Giles & John Lucas' Land West Two hundred eighty six perches
 to a post Then by the afores^d Heaton's Land South Twenty one perches and a half
 to a post Then by said Heaton's Land West sixteen degrs South forty five perches
 to a black oak Then west by south by s^d Heaton's Land Three hundred & four perches
 to the place of Beginning Containing Three hundred and Thirty acres Surveyed & Certified
 the 17th day of the 2^d month 1701 p. Phineas Pemberton
