survey'd unto him ye 5<sup>d</sup> Number of Acres in ye afores<sup>d</sup> County joyning to Tho:  
Constable provided it be not ~~taken~~ already taken up, according to ye method  
of Township appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's  
office. Given at Philadelphia ye 3<sup>d</sup> of ye 2<sup>d</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1684  
It is four hundred Acres.
