

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated the 30th of 3^d month 1703 for Surveying unto Henry Paxson one hundred Acres of Land bought by him of John Day in part of Edward Jefferson and Mercy his Wife their Original Purchase of fifteen hundred Acres Surveyed and laid out the said Quantity of one hundred Acres Situate ⁱⁿ Soulbury Township in the Conty of Bucks beginning at a post standing by Delaware River at the corner of Richard Burges Land Thence by the said Burges Land South three degrees West one hundred and eighty perches to a black oak tree Thence North West by the Land of William Crousdal ~~land~~ and Vacant Land two hundred and thirty two perches to a Chesnut tree standing by the aforesaid Delaware River Thence by the said River East five degrees North one hundred and seventy seven perches to the first mentioned post
