



Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General dated the 20th day of the 6th month 1700 Surveyed unto Mercy Philips in Right of her former husband Edward Jefferson a Tract of Land within the County of Bucks Beginning at a heap of stones being the corner of Thomas Parsons Land Then by William Cooper & Richard Tucker's Land north west two hundred and fifteen perches to a white oak being a corner of Peter Worrals Land Thence by the said Worrals Land north east two hundred and ninety eight perches to a post Then by Vacant Land south east two hundred and fifteen perches to a post Then by the Land of the afore said Thomas Parsons south west Two hundred ninety eight perches ^{& 70 perches} to the place of Beginning Containeing four hundred acres, Certified under my hand 5th day of the third month 1701
