

By virtue of a warrant from the Com^{rs} of property bearing date the 12th day of the 2^d month 1703 and by virtue of an order from Jacob Taylor grounded upon the said warrant to me directed Requesting me to Resurvey a certain Tract of Land Belonging to Alexander Parker Containing one Thousand fifty and five acres and an half in Bucks County beginning at a marked whit oak being the corner of Samuel Carpenter deceased corner now William Fishburns Land and then north west four hundred and tenn pearches to a Spanish oak marked with SC by the said Fishburns Land then north east by a Line of marked trees four hundred and twelve perches to a small black oak for a corner standing in the Line of the Land Lat. of Nathan Stanberry then by the said Stanberry's Land and others South east four hundred and tenn pearches to a post standing by a great whit oak then south west four hundred and twelve perches by the Line of Warminster Township to the Land of William Stockett and Gilbert to the place of beginning Resurveyed the the fourteenth day of the third month in the year one thousand seven hundred and ^{twenty} five By me
