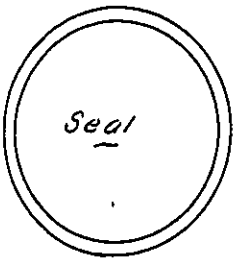

in right of himself That I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres

5^d first Purchase. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be
Survey'd unto him the said number of Acres of Land not yet Survey'd, Laid out,
nor concealed, according to the Method of Townships by me appointed. He
taking out a Patent for ye same within three Months, th in three months
after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, ^{ch} thou
art hereby required to doe with all convenient speed. Given under my
hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 17th day of ye 7th moth 1700
