Whereas I understand, y^t one Thomas Atkinson hath bought
of one of my Purchasers five hundred Acres of Land, & taken y^m up
together at ye Falls, w^{ch} is contrary to my order & Custom: And since John
Rowland hath requested me, y^t I would grant him to take up Three hund-
red Acres of his Purchase: These are to will & require thee forthwth to survey
or cause to be survey'd unto him ye half of ye s^d five hundred Acres fast
Land and Swamp joyning thereto on ye outside fifty Acres more for com-
pleating his Three hundred Acres, according to the Method of Townships
appointed by me, and make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office.
Given at Pennberry ye 7th 7^{de} 1683
