Pennsylvania & ye Territories thereunto belonging

At ye Request of Francis Richardson Purchaser, y<sup>t</sup> I would  
grant him to take up a piece of Land on ye River Delaware. These are  
to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto  
him Three hundred Acres of Land of ye Land formerly survey'd to Arthur  
Cook, joyning to ye Land of Griffith Jones & y<sup>t</sup> layd out for Silas Crispin,  
above ye ferry House over ag<sup>t</sup> Burlington, he seating & improving ye  
same w<sup>th</sup> in one year after ye Date of Survey, & make Returns thereof  
into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 2<sup>d</sup> of ye 6<sup>m</sup> 1684.
