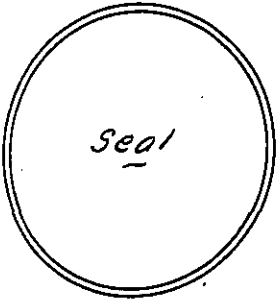

At the Request of Thomas Roberts of — that we would Grant him to take up two hundred acres of Land within the Tract called the Great Swamp in Bucks County for which ~~which~~ he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use Six & Twenty pounds thirteen Shillings and four pence for y^e whole & the usual yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Thomas Roberts in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secret^{ry} Office which Survey in case the said Thomas Roberts fulfill the above agreement ^{upon} at the said Survey shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of y^e 1st Month Anno Q^{uo} 171⁶
