



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property to me directed bearing date the eight day of the seventh month 1704 to Resurvey unto Nathan Standbury a Tract of Land Laid out unto him in the County of Bucks for five hundred Acres in right of Arthur Cook, Resurveyed the 5<sup>d</sup> Tract of Land Lying neare Neshameneh Creek in the 5<sup>d</sup> County Beginning at a Post standing in the Line of Land laid out to John Tatham between a black oak & a small Hickory both marked, from thence South West by the Lands of Benjamin Furley four hundred eighty two perches to a great white oak, Then North West by Land the owner unknown one hundred & eighty perches to a Post between a white oak & a small black oak both marked, Then North east by Land the owner unknown four hundred eighty two perches to a white oak in the 5<sup>d</sup> Tathams line, Then by the 5<sup>d</sup> Line South east one hundred & eighty perches To the place of beginning Containing five hundred forty two acres & forty perches. Resurvey the tenth day of the eighth month 1707 By me John Cutler
