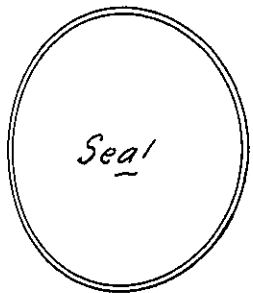

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed

At the Request of Jn^o Surket That I would grant him a Re-
survey on a certain Tract of Land in Bristol Township in the County of Bucks
reputed to contain ninety acres being part of a Tract of one hundred acres
laid out to W^m Dungan, Also on a Tract of four hundred acres in the said
Township formerly laid out to Arthur Cook but now both in the lawful
possession of the s^d Jn^o Surket: These are to require thee forthwith to
resurvey or cause to be Resurveyed the two said Tracts according to their
first lines of survey and make exact returns thereof into my Secretaries
office Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 11th day of the
11th month 1700.
