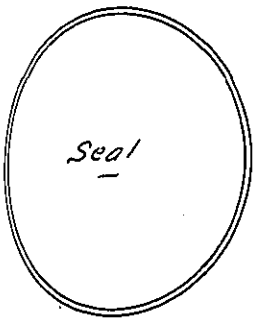


Pennsylvania 55.



By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas there was heretofore Survey'd unto Thomas Hudson five
 Thousand Acres of Land in the County of Bucks whose Attorney William Biles
 in his life time sold & Convey'd the same unto William Lawrence John Talman
 Samuel Thorne & Joseph Thorne & Benj. Field all of Long Island. But by means
 of a Prior Survey made on ye said Tract of Land by one Dennis Rochford
 the Survey of Thomas Hudson became void. Whereupon the said W^m Law-
 rence John Talman Jos: Throne & Benj: Field by Sundry Deeds Convey'd
 4000 acres of the said 5000 acres unto Thomas Stevenson in his lifetime
 whose Relict and Execut^{rs} since his decease has obtained a Warrant for
 Locating the same. And Whereas there remains to the said Sam^l Throne 1000 acres
 being his share of the above mentioned Tract (the full complement of the same) which
 is yet to be taken up anew. These are to authorize and Require thee to survey or
 Cause to be Survey'd unto the said Samuel Throne or to such as shall Lawfully Represent
 the said quantity of One Thousand Acres of Land in this Province according to the
 Method of Townships appointed and that is not already survey'd nor seated by the Indians
 and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys office Given under our hands & seal of
 the Province at Philadelphia the 14th day of October Anno 1720
