



Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General dated the 20th day of the 5th month 1700 surveyed unto Peter Worrall one Tract of Land in Right of John Alsop Beginning at a white oak being the corner of Mercy Philips Land then by Tucker & Gibsons Land north west one hundred and seventy two perches to a heap of stones made for a corner then by vacant Land north east three hundred seventy two perches and a half to a post then south east by vacant Land one hundred seventy two perches and a half then by vacant Land & Mercy Philips Land ^{South West} three hundred seventy two perches and a half to the place of beginning Containeing four hundred acres ^{& 70 perches} Surveyed and Certified under my hand the 6th day of the 3rd month 1701 P.
