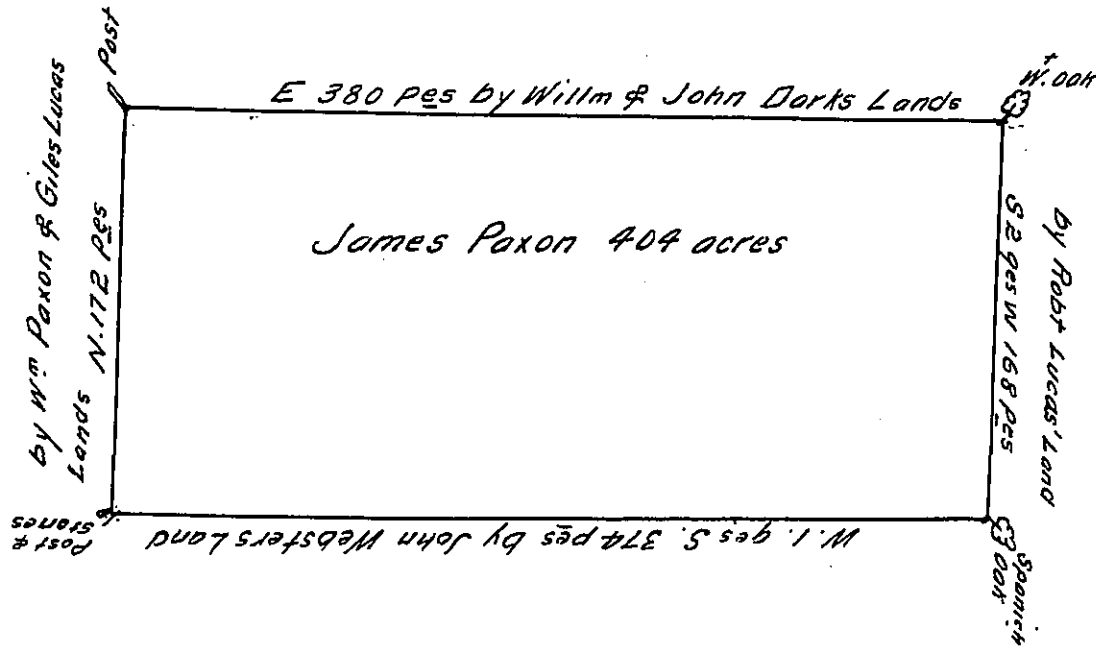

Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Pennington Surveyor General dated the 24th day of the first month 1799. Resurveyed unto James Paxson one Tract of Land Beginning at a white oak standing in the line of William and John Darks Land Then by the Land of Robt. Lucas' South Two degrees west one hundred and sixty eight perches to a small Spanish oak Then by John Websters Land west one degree South three hundred Seventy four perches to a post and a heap of stones' Then by William Paxson & Giles Lucas' Land north one hundred seventy two perches to a post Then by the aforesaid Darks Land East Three hundred and eighty perches to the place of beginning containeing four hundred and four acres' surveyed & Certified the 15th day of the 2nd month 1701 p
